Robert Sungenis: "Resolved: The Roman Catholic Magisterium, the Bible, and Apostolic tradition constitutes the authorities for Christian faith and practice." 2011 A.D.

Quoted so freely from the New Testament that, except for a few verses, the entire 27 Books can be accurately reproduced.

Since then, however, "Tradition" has taken over as authority, and the list of people who have believed and practiced a thing takes precedence over any and all Scripture references!
