Assurance Management #5 – Matthew 5:38-42

## Matthew 5:38-42:

"You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' 39 But I tell you not to resist an evil person. But whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also. 40 If anyone wants to sue you and take away your tunic, let him have your cloak also. 41 And whoever compels you to go one mile, go with him two. 42 Give to him who asks you, and from him who wants to borrow from you do not turn away."

## 2. CONTRAST

**Assurance Management #6 -**

Matthew 5:38: "You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.'"

- 1. Where was it said?
  - A. Miscarriage-Exodus 21:22-27;
  - B. Scarring-Leviticus 24:17-22;
  - C. False Witness-Deuteronomy 19:14-21
- 2. It was the legal punishment for crimes to the person, NOT personal retaliation!

**Assurance Management #7 -**

Matthew 5:39: "But I tell you not to resist an evil person. But whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also."

- 1. Leave "getting even" to God Romans 12:19; Hebrews 10:28-31; Deuteronomy 32:35-36
- 2. This doesn't forbid renouncing evil-doers John 18:19-24; Acts 23:1-5
- 3. Wisdom is against retaliation **Proverbs 20:22; 24:29**

**Assurance Management #8 -**

Matthew 5:40: "If anyone wants to sue you and take away your tunic, let him have your cloak also."

- Which garment one is sued for is indifferent, because Luke 6:29 shows that it is a "package deal," that is, be willing to settle.
- 2. Especially if this involves a brother in Christ! 1 Corinthians 6:1-8
- 3. Remember Matthew 5:25?

**Assurance Management #9 -**

## Matthew 5:41: "And whoever compels you to go one mile, go with him two"

- 1. This is what happened to Simon of Cyrene Matthew 27:32; Mark 15:21
- 2. Jesus used this to show His Kingly authority Matthew 21:1-7; Zechariah 9:9

**Assurance Management #10 -**

Matthew 5:42: "Give to him who asks you, and from him who wants to borrow from you do not turn away."

- 1. An Old Testament principle

  Deuteronomy 15:1-11
- 2. Now a New Testament principle Luke 6:29-36
- 3. NOT, however, indiscriminately so, but erring toward the merciful side.
- 4. God gives "according to His will"

  1 John 3:22

Affection Management #1

Matthew 5:43-48: "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' 44 But I say to you, 'love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you, 45 that you may be sons of your Father in heaven; for He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. 46 For if you love those who love you, what reward have you? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? 47 And if you greet your brethren only, what do you do more than others? Do not even the tax collectors do so? 48 Therefore you shall be perfect, just as your Father in heaven is perfect."

Spiritual Growth In The Kingdom Matthew 5:13-7:12

Matthew 5:43: "You have heard that it was said, "You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy."

- 1. Where is the source of this quote?
  - a. NOT in Leviticus 19:18
  - b. BUT in Rabbinical "interpretations"
- 2. When uninspired people give their commentary, interpretation, or application of Scripture, it is not the same as Scripture saying something! Ecclesiastes 8:1

Jesus' teaches His point! Mark 4:33-34
OR Scripture makes its own point!
Matthew 9:10-13; 12:1-8

Matthew 5:44-45: But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you, 45 that you may be sons of your Father in heaven; for He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust."

- 1. Love is inclusive of "grace & mercy" or seeing their need for good in their misery
- 2. God sets the example every day that some good must be done regardless of others' attitudes toward us.

Matthew 5:46-48: "For if you love those who love you, what reward have you? Do not even the tax collectors do the same?

47 And if you greet your brethren only, what do you do more than others? Do not even the tax collectors do so? 48 Therefore you shall be perfect, just as your Father in heaven is perfect."

- 1. "Flat-lining" love is NOT acceptable!
- 2. "Perfection" is in consistentlyapplied attitude, not sinless actions! Luke 6:36; 1 Peter 1:15-16
- 3. It's NOT impossible! Ephesians 5:1-2
