- Jesus left "an example" (Gk. hupogrammos a writing copy)

B. Wives, Take It Like the Holy Women of Old 3:1-6

- Inner beauty "precious" to God (Gk. polutelays very costly, of surpassing value) 3:4; Mark 14:3; 1 Timothy 2:9* Cf (polutimos of great price) 1 Peter 1:7; Matthew 13:46; 26:7; John 12:3*

C. Husbands, Take It Like You Know Better 3:7

- Treat wives with "honor" (Gk. timay- reverence) 3:7b; 1:7; 2:7;

- OR DON'T BOTHER TO PRAY TO GOD! 3:7C (Gk. egkoptoo impede one's course by cutting off his way) Galatians 5:7;

- D. All of You, Take It Like You Mean It 3:8-22
 - 1. All Christians should act the same 3:8-9
 - 2. God prophesied it so **3:10-12** (**Psalm 34:12-16**)
 - 3. Fear not 3:13-22
 - a) God/ good will not harm us
 - (1) God decreed it so v. 13; Proverbs 16:7; Romans 8:31;
 - (2) Should persecution occur, fear not v. 14; Matthew 10:28-31
 - (3) Keep your reason clear v. 15; Acts 4:8-20
 - (4) Keep your conscience clear v. 16; Hebrews 13:18;2 Corinthians 1:12
 - (a) through suffering wrongfully 1 Peter 2:19
 - (b)through being challenged by wrong-doers 1 Peter 3:15

∨. Christian People in God's Purpose 5:1-14

A. Mold to the Shepherd's Flock 5:1-7

- 1. Peter was: **5:1**
 - a) "fellow elder" (presbyter)
 - b) "witness of the sufferings of Christ" (Apostle)
 - c) "partaker of the glory that will be revealed" (Christian)
- 2. Shepherds of "the flock of God" are limited by: 5:2-3
 - a) area ("among you")

- b) desire ("not by constraint")
- c) motive ("not for dishonest gain") Cf John 10:11-13
- d) humility ("not as being lords over those entrusted to you")
- e) goal ("receive the crown of glory")

B. Bold to the Devil's Block 5:8-11

- 1. Powerful Discriminating Attitude
 - a) "Sober"- Gk. *nayphoo* calm and collected in spirit, dispassionate

 1 Peter 1:13; 4:7; 1 Thessalonians 5:6, 8; 2 Timothy 4:5
 - b) "Vigilant" Gk. *graygoreoo* give strict attention to
 Matthew 24:41-42; 1 Thessalonians 5:6;
 1 Corinthians 16:13
- 2. Powerful Indiscriminate Adversary
 - a) "Like a roaring lion"
 - b) "Seeking whom he may devour"
- 3. Powerful Individual Accomplishment
 - a) Gk. **antitassoo** to range in battle against **Romans 13:2**; **James 4:6**; **5:6**
 - b) Gk. stereos firm, hard, hard, rigid 2 Timothy 2:19;Hebrews 5:12, 14*
 - c) There is NOTHING PERSONAL in a Christian's persecution!!!
 - d) Jesus resisted the Devil, but "the Devil departed from Him until an opportune time." Matthew 4:1-11; Luke 4:1-13
 - e) **Cannot be "objective,"** must "submit to God" to win **James 4:7-8**

C. Hold to Christ Jesus' Rock 5:12-14

- 1. v.12 Silvanus has; a.k.a. "Silas" Acts 15:40-41; 18:1, 5-8
- 2. v.13 The church in Jerusalem Ephesians 5:25, 27; 2 John 1
- 3. v. 14 Encourage one another

Pondering First Peter:

* The Bible Tradition of Peter. He was:

- 1. Simon son of Jonah (Matthew 16:17);
- 2. brother of Andrew (John 1:40-41);
- 3. whose name Jesus changed to "Cephas" a.k.a. "Rock" (John 1:42);
- originally was from Bethsaida (John 1:44);
- married and moved to Capernaum (Luke 4:31, 38);
- 6. was partner in the fishing business with James and John, sons of Zebedee (**Luke 5:10**);
- 7. and became convinced to follow Jesus after a miracle (Luke 5:1-11).
- 8. **First Peter** coincides with his personal experiences in following Christ. He:
 - 1. occupied a leadership place among the Apostles;
 - was second to James in the Jerusalem church (Acts 12:1-3;
 Cf Galatians 2:9) until Acts 15 and thereafter isn't mentioned in the Book of Acts.
- 9. Uninspired "Tradition," **not Scripture**, has Peter visiting Rome and being crucified upside down after refusing to be crucified exactly like Christ! Jesus had predicted Peter's later life (**John 21:17-19**).

* I Peter is written from "Babylon" to "the pilgrims of the Dispersion" (I Peter 1:1; 5:13).

- 1. "The Dispersion" obviously refers to the scattered Jewish disciples of Christ throughout the world as a result of the Jewish persecution of Christ's converts which began in Jerusalem with the stoning of Stephen (Acts 6:8-8:4; 11:19).
- 2. Since Peter was the next Apostle to be killed in Jerusalem after James (Acts 12:1-3), it is easy to see that in the New Testament, Jerusalem opposed God's law and prophets (Acts 3:13-15; 7:51-8:1; Acts 13:26-30) as it had in the past when it was destroyed by the Chaldean Babylon under Nebuchadnezzar, whom God then destroyed (2 Chronicles 36:15-23; Jeremiah 50:1, 17-18, 24-25, 29-46; Jeremiah 51:5-12, 24-29, 34-35, 47-49, 54-55, 59-64). God decreed "'And I will repay Babylon and all the inhabitants of Chaldea

- for all the evil they have done in Zion in your sight,' says the LORD" (Jeremiah 51:24).
- 3. In the New Testament, as Babylon had before, the wicked Jews persecuted God's people (now "the Israel of God," Galatians 6:15-16, and the gospel spread from Jerusalem by dispersing Christians through persecution.
- 4. Like Babylon before, God brought final judgment against Jerusalem through Rome in A.D.70 (I Thessalonians 2:14-16; Revelation 11:8; 14:8; 16:19; 17:1-6; 18:1-6, and then God brought down Rome (Cf Book of Revelation).

* Hence, the book is to be dated after Acts 6:8-8:4 because:

- 1. It is explaining why Christians must suffer, not only bodily persecution, but verbal abuse as well;
- 2. But before Jerusalem's destruction in A.D. 70.
- 3. Since Paul's 3rd journey (about A.D. 54-57) took him through Galatia and Phrygia to Ephesus (from which he wrote Galatians), and since neither Paul, his work, nor his epistle(s) are mentioned here, it may show that this letter was written before his work in these places named by Peter (I Peter 1:1), i.e. before A.D. 54.
 Many dates are inexact.
