Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you do not appear to men to be fasting, but to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly. (Matthew 6:16-18)

A face marked with "ashes" should be washed. Proclaiming to others that you're fasting makes you a "hypocrite." And fasting like a hypocrite has no reward from God! What doesn't please God isn't for a Christian.

No. But every snowflake they have examined is different; therefore a reasonable conclusion is, "No two snowflakes are alike." The evidence they have points to a conclusion beyond their sight.

That's exactly how we know God exists: the overwhelming evidence we have demands the conclusion that only God could have done it.

He who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him. (Hebrews 11:6)
