

QA: Will Christ Have a Kingdom on Earth? by John T Polk II

All Scriptures and comments are based on the **New King James Version**, unless otherwise noted.

QUESTION: Will Christ have a kingdom on earth?

ANSWER: Not in the future. Since the 1st Century, people saved by Jesus' blood have been "conveyed into the kingdom of the Son of His love" (Colossians 1:13-14). False teachers teach other than sound doctrine and "do not consent to wholesome words, even the words of our Lord Jesus Christ" 1 Timothy 6:3. Every part of Millennial doctrine is "antichrist" 1 John 4:1-3. Premillennialism contradicts Jesus Christ Matthew 16:23

They must necessarily be claiming that:

- 1. Jesus Failed to already establish His kingdom
 - a. Then there is no observance of His supper! Luke 22:17-20
 - b. Then there is no new birth into His kingdom! John 3:3, 5
- 2. Jesus Failed to already sit on David's throne. The facts are:
 - a. That Jesus died and was buried. Acts 2:23-24
 - b. That David's prophecy said Jesus would not be in the grave longer than 3 days before being raised out of it! Acts 2:25-28 (Psalm 16:8-11)
 - c. That Jesus was raised "to sit" on David's throne in heaven! Acts 2:29-33; If Jesus is not now on David's throne in heaven, as Peter and the Apostles preached on Pentecost, then Jesus Christ has never been raised from the dead!
- 3. Jesus Failed to overcome Satan Armageddon Still Needed
 - a. But Jesus said He came to do this. John 12:31-33
 - b. Luke wrote Jesus' claim He accomplished this very thing! Luke 10:17-18
 - c. If He did not, then there has been NO CRUCIFIXION for our sins! 1 John 3:8
- 4. Jesus will restore Moses' Law & the Jewish kingdom
 - a. But Jesus said the Jews would lose the kingdom. Matthew 21:43, 45
 - b. The animal blood of Moses' Law saved no one. Hebrews 9:12
 - c. If Moses' Law made one righteous, Christ died in vain! Galatians 2:21
- 5. Jesus will establish an earthly kingdom
 - a. But that's the kind of kingdom they claim Jesus failed to establish when He came to the earth the first time! He never was, nor will be "The King of the Jews"
 - b. That's the kind of kingdom Jesus denied He established. John 18:36

Christians will "stand fast and hold the traditions which you were taught, whether by word or our epistle" 2 Thessalonians 2:15. Millennialists must be "born again" John 3:5 into Jesus' spiritual kingdom.
