

QA: Should the Nashville Shooter's "Manifesto" Be Made Public? by John T Polk II

All Scriptures and comments are based on the **New King James Version**, unless otherwise noted.

QUESTION: The 28-year-old Nashville school shooter who murdered six people March 28, 2023 left a "manifesto" that has not yet been released. Shouldn't the public know what's in it?

ANSWER: NO. The murderous, twisted (born female, tried to change to male) reasoning used to justify such evil does NOT need to be read, and possibly accepted (!) by anyone else.

1. Ephesians 5:11-14:

And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather expose them. For it is shameful even to speak of those things which are done by them in secret. But all things that are exposed are made manifest by the light, for whatever makes manifest is light. Therefore He says: "Awake, you who sleep, Arise from the dead, And Christ will give you light." (Ephesians 5:11-14)

According to God:

- 1) Evil thoughts and actions should be "exposed" or made manifest by the light of God's Word, that is, with judgment;
- 2) Once exposed, evil can only be corrected by acknowledging and obeying Jesus Christ;
- "Secret" things need not be explained for all to know, because they could cause defective thinking in innocent people. It is enough to know why evil is done:

For this is the message that you heard from the beginning, that we should love one another, not as Cain who was of the wicked one and murdered his brother. And why did he murder him? Because his works were evil and his brother's righteous. (**1 John 3:11-12**)

2. Jack Phillips, April 21, 2023, wrote in The Epoch Times:

About 20 journals, five laptops, a suicide note, and other materials written by Hale were taken from the house where she lived with her parents, according to a search warrant in the case

"What I was told is, her manifesto was a blueprint on total destruction, and it was so, so detailed at the level of what she had planned," Metro Nashville Council Member Courtney Johnston told the NY Post, without elaborating. "That document in the wrong person's hands would be astronomically dangerous," she added.

3. The Wicked: ...

The wicked may shoot in secret at the blameless; Suddenly they shoot at him and do not fear. They encourage themselves in an evil matter; They talk of laying snares secretly; They say, "Who will see them?" (Psalm 64:4-5)
